"I had no idea there were so many homeless veterans in this area, so I love that I can cook for them," she said.

Breakfast is often oatmeal or pancakes, eggs, bacon or sausage.

For all meals, Mallory picks from a list of food available at the food bank and plans meals from there,

She serves up more than food. She finds that many of the veterans open up to her.

"I love that I'm helping. I love cooking and I love helping people who need it."

"Before we can even begin to address the root causes of veteran homelessness, we must ensure that our veterans are healthy. Many of our veterans haven't seen a doctor in years," said Tom Zimmerman, cofounder and chairman, Board of Directors, Veterans Outreach of PA. "Having access to medical experts whenever needed, through the convenience of telemedicine, is a godsend, and we are truly grateful to UPMC for adding to their already generous contributions to Veterans Grove through the gift of this high-tech equipment. We appreciate having the power to serve veterans where they are, eliminating commute times, protecting their privacy and security, and expediting recovery times."

Representatives from UPMC Telemedicine delivered and set up all the needed telemedicine equipment, including a computer, monitor, keyboard, mouse, blood pressure cuff (arm), blood pressure cuff (wrist), digital scale, digital stethoscope, cameras, speakers, and additional clinical tools.
